Message from our pastor

I remember the day I received a phone call from a search committee regarding a church named Lakeview Baptist located in Battle Creek, Michigan. It was early January, 2011. Those on the search team spoke of their hopes and dreams of what God might do during their next season of ministry. The opportunity intrigued Tonya and I so we planned a visit and further conversation. Six months later, you called me as your pastor.

A lot has happened over the past eight years. Several weddings, many funerals, baptisms and baby dedications. Our 3rd child, Kylie, was born.

The church council began a process of discernment regarding the vision and direction of our church through a process called Retool. This lead to a complete overhaul of our organizational structure, constitution and initiated a new commitment towards three key guiding principles of ministry: we would become a people who would Gather, Grow, and Go. That is, we would Gather around the feet of Jesus every Sunday, worshipping him as our Lord and Savior. We would Grow and mature in faith and knowledge of God and also in friendship with one another. We would Go from this place to love and serve the world in Jesus' name.

Gathering, Growing and Going became our mantra and vision of what a disciple of Jesus is and does.

In 2017, we were lead to sell our church facility to the Falam Baptist Church, a newer American Baptist church plant that had been meeting in our facility for a few years. The decision was a difficult one made with much heartache, but with hope that God had his own plans for our own congregation. This was proven to be true in that a new facility, located just a mile and a half away, was going to be made available near the exact time we sold our own building. It was a reminder of God's faithfulness to us and that his timing is amazing. As we've been renovating this new facility located at Golden Avenue and Riverside Drive, many people have commented that it is starting to feel like "home."

A few other memories come to mind of what God has done during our time together:

*Purchasing a clean water system for a hill tribe village in Northern Thailand (through our American Baptist International Ministries missionaries Mike and Becky Mann).

*Vacation Bible School

Jungle Adventure: A Journey with Jesus; Dive Deep; Hay Day: Growing in Friendship with Jesus.

*Many "Trunk or Treats" on Halloween.

*The beginning of "Kids Church" a new type of Sunday school for kids that would meet at the same time as our church service.

*International Ministries Mission conference in Green Lake, Wisconsin.

*The beginning of a weekly coffee hour/fellowship time after every worship service.

*Lakeview Meadows fire response. And what a response this was! For a number of weeks, we accepted and distributed donations for individuals affected by the fire at the apartment across the street! Our sanctuary was packed full of items to give away!

*Many Christmas and Thanksgiving food and gift basket giveaways during these holiday times.

*Under the "Go" team, new outreaches to local schools were initiated including the giving of cleaning supplies, clothing, and volunteering as "Reading Buddies."

*Family Camp at Lake Louise Baptist Camp.

*Our annual Lakeside Baptism worship services at Willard Beach/Goguac Lake.

*The ongoing renovation of our new church "home" that help make it an excellent place of ministry.

These are only a few of the many things that God has done in our midst over the past several years!

In Acts chapter 16, the apostle Paul shared the gospel with a small group of women who had gathered by a river in the city of Philippi. Those who heard the gospel responded with joy. Before he would leave town, others THE ENCOURAGER PAGE 2

had come to a saving knowledge of faith in Jesus Christ and a small church was established. Years later, Paul considered them to be a strong partner in gospel ministry.

In Philippians chapter 1, he talks fondly of this church as he writes to them:

3 I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. 7 It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart and, whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me. 8 God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. 9 And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, 10 so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, 11 filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ-to the glory and praise of God.

As many things as we have accomplished as a church over the past few years, I am even more deeply grateful for the friendships that Tonya and I (and the kids) have been able to build with you. In a similar way, I could also write... "I thank my God every time I remember you...I always pray with joy...it is right for me to feel this way... I have you in my heart..."

Getting to spend our lives ministering alongside of you has been a deep joy for our family. In years to come, we know we will look back and remember our time together with fondness and love.

I conclude by echoing the prayer that Paul had for the Philippian church. And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, 10 so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, 11 filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

Dear friends at Lakeview Baptist Church,

Hello from our family to you and your loved ones. We are in Hungary this month, following up with Gypsy house churches. We first met these families three years ago in conjunction with West Virginian Baptists and Anita's family here. The Lord called us to South Africa in a ministry of health promotion, training, interactive Bible study and home economy promotion. We continue in our primary mission in South Africa, even as God helps us to spread this branch here in the Old World. The need for God's clear guidance and encouragement cries out in the families we are with here- as it does back in our home in Durban. Themes of underemployment, alienation and substance abuse with the attendant despair and poor health are written into the shortened lives and worried faces. Yet there is something more- the Joy of the Lord in the knowing Jesus Christ who keeps our head from sinking. The testimony of believers who are honest about where they been- even as they give hope to their friends and families because of who they are now in Christ. This too is our story. As we experience spring in this village of Kunfeherto, we are encouraged that the gardening and orchard keeping success of these villagers will also become the reality for our brothers and sisters in South Africa. What's needed is the cultural change of tending land which follows hope of gaining your own harvest. Transforming people's health is a big nut to crack. Because of you, we can spend our time working with three major elements and creative synthesis. The Bible is our collective heritage. Health Building allows common men and women to become effective health promoters. Poultry, gardening and trees turn God's grace and provision into food and modest income. It takes time, but our shared investment of prayer, creativity, industry and patient cooperation with hurting people does bring personal redemption and new siblings in our family in Christ. Now because of you we share the skills and knowledge gained working in Africa with people who have similar problems here in central Europe. What we see and learn here gives us new eyes and clearer vision for more effective mission back home in South Africa.

Thank you for your gifts totaling \$376 between December 2018 and March 2019. Our American base is still Kalamazoo, and we hope to see you in Michigan in 2020. Know that you are a blessing- we thank the Lord for the ways in which you allow life to flourish through your faithful generosity.


